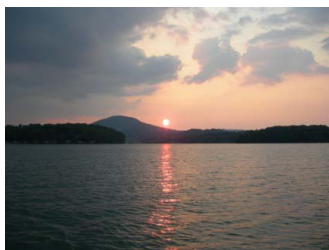

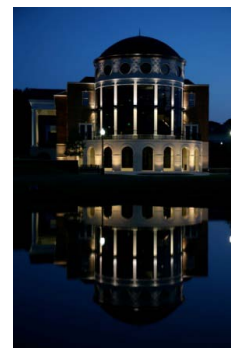

BASEBALL

Saturday, March 6th the baseball team won the championship game of the Polk Oil Classic Tournament at Central High School. Cody Bryant was named MVP of the tournament. Thursday and Friday the team played in a competitive Lindale Tournament where they came away with 2 wins and 2 losses. Jake Beam pitched a complete game 4-2 victory vs. 4A Trimble Tech of Ft. Worth. Verses Rains HS, Cody Bryant, Robbie Duck and Tyler Burton combined time on the mound to help the Guard get the victory. And Jared Dickey pitched a fantastic game vs. Lindale despite the loss. Jake Beam, A.J. Minter, and J.B. Moss all hit HRs in the tournament.

TRACK AND FIELD

The Brook Hill Middle School Track and Field Team got their competitive season underway with a outstanding effort in the Reagan Kelley Relays at McCallum Stadium at T. K. Gorman Catholic High School. The 7th and 8th grade boys and girls teams all finished 3rd in the finals standings of the eight team event.

A number of athletes secured gold medals. Hayden Langemeier won the 8th grade high jump. Gabe Lucio doubled in the 7th grade shot put and discus. Ashley Searcy pulled out a win in the 8th grade discus.

Among the great performances was the 6th and 7th grade girls who literally put on a show all day winning eight of seventeen events and nearly pulling off a team win despite going against much larger teams. Morgan Moss won three individual gold medals and one more as the anchor leg of the 4 x 100 relay team that included Katherine Stair, Charlie Niles, Avery Langemeier. Avery Langemeier also won the 1600 meter and 2400 meter run. Cassie Morris doubled with wins in each of her last throws in the shot put and discus. Nicki Evans set a personal record for a first place win in the high jump.
