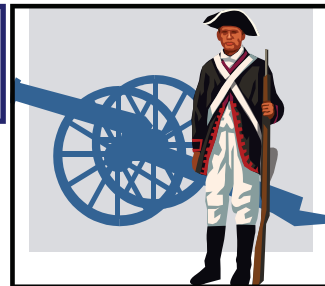

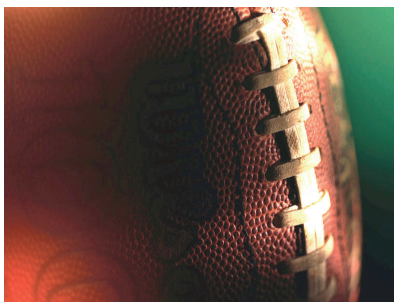

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NOTES FROM COACH KLACZAK



Quote of the Week:

For the third year in a row, the Brook Hill Guard opened its season with a victory. This year, the Guard took on the Hawkins Hawks and won 28-7. We have upgraded this year’s schedule to make certain that the team is better prepared for the state playoffs. Hawkins was the first step. Our defense played very well and held the Hawks to 140 yards of total offense and no touchdowns. Their only score came on a kickoff return - special teams will be worked harder this week. Gang tackling was the theme of the day. Defensive ends Austin Pile and Jacob Johnson did a great job putting outside pressure on the Hawks “O”. Timo Campbell, Tallen Harris, Luke Molidor, Ross Lee and Matt Ruark held up the inside on the line of scrimmage. The big plays of the day came from OLB Ross Nichols with one interception and one fumble recovery and Jeremey Chappelle who had several big hits.

Offensively, we showed some “rust” from missing our second scrimmage. I was pleased with our effort but not our execution. When we were “on”, our option and offense worked well. Quarterback Tyler Baker (1 touchdown, 1 touchdown pass), running back Jamel Bell (one touchdown), and Luke Molidor (1 touchdown) did a great job with the running game. Quarterbacks Tyler Baker and Ross Nichols were a combined 6 for 10 passing. The highlight was a great TD catch by T(r)avis Harris to end the first half. The “O” line was sporadic but came through when needed. One special highlight was the blocking of our wide receivers, Jeremey Chappelle, Tavis Harris, Preston Swink, James Arterberry and Wesley Woods. Our next opponent is San Augustine on Friday, September 12th at 7:30PM at home. SA defeated defending state champ Alto, so this next game will be a real test.

Spotlight on Coach Austin Reed

Coach Reed is originally from Norman, OK and is a Sooner through and through. His parents both went to the University of Oklahoma and although Coach Reed went to Ouachita Baptist University, he still follows the Sooners football team with a passion. Coach Reed graduated with a degree in Biblical Studies and also received a Masters in Biblical Studies from the Denver Seminary. Originally he was interested in being a youth minister, but was drawn to teaching during his last year at the seminary. He has always loved sports and decided that teaching and coaching as well as ministry would be a great career combination.

Coach Reed loves both football and baseball. He is a baseball player by trade and has some college experience. He grew up as a catcher and played both third base and right field in high school. He has always loved football and played a bit of football in high school as well. He loves learning about football strategy and finds that being a coach is another avenue in which he can impact kids. 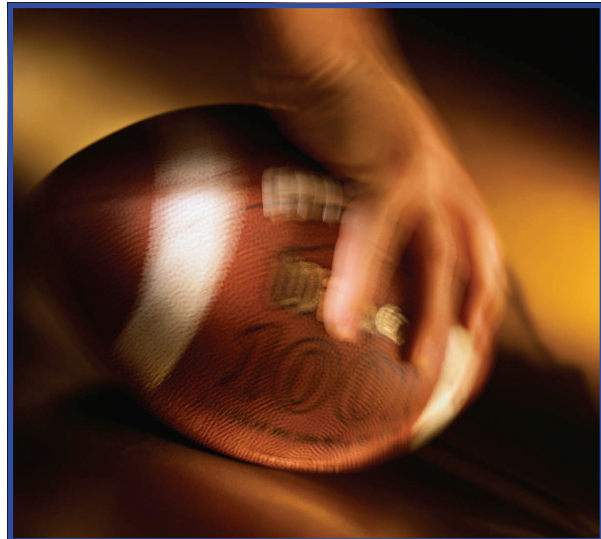
