- Also, you are to make a new picture for the cover of the novel! As you read, think about what you might do if you were assigned this job. Draw your 'cover' on a sheet of white paper and have it ready to turn in with your answered questions when school starts. Don't forget to include the title and author's name on the book cover.

2. History book: The American Republic to 1877 (pages 37-65)

Read chapter 2, *Exploring the Americas*. After you have read each section, do the Section Assessment (1-6). Write your answers for 2-6 in complete sentences unless you are asked to draw a graph or chart. At the end of chapter 2 you are to do the Chapter assessment 1-24 (complete sentences for 4-16. Note: #24 requires a little research and is supposed to be typed!) All the work over chapter 2 will be graded when you return to school. After discussion of the chapter, you will be tested on what you learned. Read carefully—don't just look for the answers!
