- 1. **Pg 133-** The author does such a good job of creating a tense atmosphere. She uses certain words to help her do this.
- 2. **Pg 180-** This part was very engaging because one speaker was able to bring down the whole graduation. All the black teachers, parents, and graduates realize that no matter how smart they are, their skin color will classify them as maids and farmers.

- 3. **Pg 218-** In this part of the story, Marguerite grows stronger as a character. She is able to identify the people who have formed her into the person that she is. Not a lot of young teenagers could even do that. Marguerite proves that she is not only tough but wise.
- 4. **Pgs 268-270-** This part was really engaging because Marguerite really displays her determination. - 1. **Ingenuity-** the quality of being cleverly inventive or resourceful; inventiveness. "[...] table but by <u>ingenuity</u> and courage [...]" (Angelou 224).
- 2. **Embezzle-** to appropriate fraudulently to one's own use, as money or property entrusted to one's care. "[...] more banks <u>embezzle</u> more funds and employ graft in the unions" (Angelou 225).
- 3. **Colloquial-** characteristic of or appropriate to ordinary or familiar conversation rather than formal speech or writing; informal. "We were alert to the gap separating the written word from the <u>colloquial</u>" (Angelou 225).
- 4. Liveried- clad in liver, as servants. "[...] and serviced by a liveried staff" (Angelou 226).
- 5. **Convoluted-** to coil up; form into a twisted shape. "[...] words and <u>convoluted</u> sentences [...]" (Angelou 227).
- 6. **Fidelity-** strict observance of promises, duties, etc. "[...] on absolute <u>fidelity</u> [...]" (Angelou 227).
- 7. **Rife-** of common or frequent occurrence; prevalent; in widespread existence, activity, or use. "[...] were <u>rife</u> in her town [...]" (Angelou 229).
- 8. **Ramshackle-** loosely made or held together; rickety; shaky. "[...] the <u>ramshackle</u> building [...]")Angelou 232).
- 9. Claque- a group of persons hired to applaud an act or performer. "[...] suddenly a <u>claque</u> of women [...]" (Angelou 232).
- 10. **Reveler-** a group of persons hired to applaud an act or performer. "[...] As new <u>revelers</u> joined [...]" (Angelou 234).
