Dear 2nd grader,

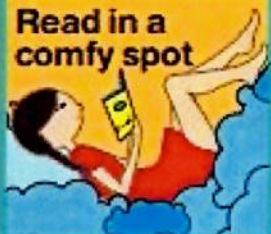
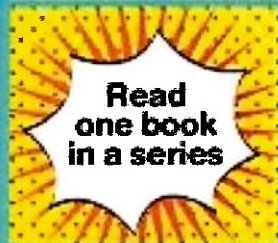
